**Program Description:** The Emergency Medical Technology/Paramedic Program at Jefferson College is designed to train persons to respond to emergency calls, to provide efficient and immediate care to the critically ill and injured, stabilize and transport the patient to a medical facility. A career ladder in Emergency Medical Technology has been established which would enable the student to stop at any level with job skills or progress to the Associate of Applied Science degree as a paramedic.

**Admission Requirements:** English Composition, American Heart Association (AHA) Healthcare Provider CPR certification, criminal background check, and the following immunizations: MMR, current PPD, Hep-B series (3 doses), Tdap, Varicella titer or vaccine (2 doses) and an influenza vaccine. Entrance process to the Paramedic Program consists of four sequential steps: application, testing, interviewing and selection and it is a highly competitive process with only the top 22 students being accepted.

**Jefferson College Program Highlights:**

- The Emergency Medical Technology Program is accredited through the Committee on accreditation of Educational Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions (CoAEMSP) and the Missouri Division of Health Bureau of Emergency Medical Services.
- The EMS Programs offer several high fidelity simulation labs including an actual ambulance simulator allowing hands on training in the back of an ambulance. The program has an ambulance driving simulator, SimMan 3G, IV computerized simulation and an extrication simulator.
- The program offers 17 Internship (ride) sites and 4 hospital clinical sites. The rides sites include Ambulance Districts and Fire Departments. The hospital clinical sites include trauma centers and Children’s and Cardinal Glennon Hospitals.
- The program has a high first-time pass rate for the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) and a high job placement for graduating students.

**Transfer Information:**

The Associate of Applied Science degree in EMT/Paramedic will generally not transfer to four-year institutions. Exceptions can be made if transferring to a four-year EMT/Paramedic Program or to an institution that has an articulation agreement in place. General education courses taken within the EMT/Paramedic degree plan may transfer to four-year institutions.
